- 1. The Philippine International Convention Center (PICC), through the Approved Budget for CY 2024 intends to apply the sum of TEN MILLION EIGHT HUNDRED FIFTY-TWO THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED SEVENTY-SIX PESOS AND EIGHTY-TWO CENTAVOS (Php10,852,876.82), VAT Inclusive, being the Approved Budget for the Contract (ABC) to payments under the contract for Supply of Labor and Materials for the Replacement of Ceiling at the Plenary Hall (APP No. 2024-UP- 40). Bids received in excess of the ABC shall be automatically rejected at bid opening.
- 2. The *PICC* now invites bids for the above Procurement Project. Completion of the Works is required within twenty-eight (28) calendar days. Bidders should have completed within the last five (5) years, a contract similar to the Project. The description of an eligible bidder is contained in the Bidding Documents, particularly, in Section II (Instructions to Bidders).
- 3. Bidding will be conducted through open competitive bidding procedures using non-discretionary "pass/fail" criterion as specified in the 2016 Revised Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of Republic Act (RA) No. 9184.
- 4. Prospective Bidders may obtain further information from the *PICC-BAC* and inspect the Bidding Documents at the address given below during office hours.
- 5. A complete set of Bidding Documents may be acquired by prospective bidders starting October 15, 2024 from the given address and website/s below and upon payment of a non-refundable fee, in the amount of Thirteen Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty Pesos (Php13,750.00). A bidder shall present its proof of payment for the fee by furnishing the PICC-BAC a copy of the Official Receipt.
- 6. The PICC-BAC will hold a Pre-Bid Conference on October 23, 2024, at 10:00 a.m. at Function Room B, 2nd Floor, Secretariat Building, PICC and/or through videoconferencing/webcasting via Zoom/Google Meet, which shall be open to prospective bidders.
- 7. Bids must be duly received by the BAC Secretariat through manual submission at the office address as indicated below, on or before November 6, 2024, at 9:30 a.m. Late bids shall not be accepted.
- 8. All bids must be accompanied by a bid security in any of the acceptable forms and in the amount stated in ITB Clause 15.

- 9. Bid opening shall be on November 6, 2024 at 10:00 a.m. at the given address below. Bids will be opened in the presence of the bidders' representatives who choose to attend the activity.
- 10. The *PICC* reserves the right to reject any and all bids, declare a failure of bidding, or not award the contract at any time prior to contract award in accordance with Sections 35.6 and 41 of the 2016 revised Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of RA No. 9184, without thereby incurring any liability to the affected bidder or bidders.

Section II. Instructions to Bidders

1. Scope of Bid

The Procuring Entity, Philippine International Convention Center invites Bids for the Supply of Labor and Materials for the Replacement of Ceiling at the Plenary Hall Number PICC APP No. 2024-MC-21.

The Procurement Project (referred to herein as "Project") is for the construction of Works, as described in Section VI (Specifications).

2. Funding Information

- 2.1. The GOP through the source of funding as indicated below for 2024 in the amount of Php8,500,000.00
- 2.2. The source of funding is:
 - a. GOCC and GFIs, the Corporate Operating Budget.

3. Bidding Requirements

The Bidding for the Project shall be governed by all the provisions of RA No. 9184 and its 2016 revised IRR, including its Generic Procurement Manual and associated policies, rules and regulations as the primary source thereof, while the herein clauses shall serve as the secondary source thereof.

Any amendments made to the IRR and other GPPB issuances shall be applicable only to the ongoing posting, advertisement, or invitation to bid by the BAC through the issuance of a supplemental or bid bulletin.

The Bidder, by the act of submitting its Bid, shall be deemed to have inspected the site, determined the general characteristics of the contracted Works and the conditions for this Project, such as the location and the nature of the work; (b) climatic conditions; (c) transportation facilities; (c) nature and condition of the terrain, geological conditions at the site communication facilities, requirements, location and availability of construction aggregates and other materials, labor, water, electric power and access roads; and (d) other factors that may affect the cost, duration and execution or implementation of the contract, project, or work and examine all instructions, forms, terms, and project requirements in the Bidding Documents.

4. Corrupt, Fraudulent, Collusive, Coercive, and Obstructive Practices

The Procuring Entity, as well as the Bidders and Contractors, shall observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement and execution of the contract. They or through an agent shall not engage in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, coercive, and obstructive practices defined under Annex "I" of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 or other integrity violations in competing for the Project.

5. Eligible Bidders

- 5.1. Only Bids of Bidders found to be legally, technically, and financially capable will be evaluated.
- 5.2. The Bidder must have an experience of having completed a Single Largest Completed Contract (SLCC) that is similar to this Project, equivalent to at least fifty percent (50%) of the ABC adjusted, if necessary, by the Bidder to current prices using the PSA's CPI, except under conditions provided for in Section 23.4.2.4 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

A contract is considered to be "similar" to the contract to be bid if it has the major categories of work stated in the **BDS**.

- 5.3. For Foreign-funded Procurement, the Procuring Entity and the foreign government/foreign or international financing institution may agree on another track record requirement, as specified in the Bidding Document prepared for this purpose.
- 5.4. The Bidders shall comply with the eligibility criteria under Section 23.4.2 of the 2016 IRR of RA No. 9184.

6. Origin of Associated Goods

There is no restriction on the origin of Goods other than those prohibited by a decision of the UN Security Council taken under Chapter VII of the Charter of the UN.

7. Subcontracts

7.1. The Bidder may subcontract portions of the Project to the extent allowed by the Procuring Entity as stated herein, but in no case more than fifty percent (50%) of the Project.

The Procuring Entity has prescribed that:

- a. Subcontracting is not allowed.
- 7.1. [If Procuring Entity has determined that subcontracting is allowed during the bidding, state:] The Bidder must submit together with its Bid the documentary requirements of the subcontractor(s) complying with the eligibility criteria stated in ITB Clause 5 in accordance with Section 23.4 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 pursuant to Section 23.1 thereof.
- 7.2. [If subcontracting is allowed during the contract implementation stage, state:] The Supplier may identify its subcontractor during the contract implementation stage. Subcontractors identified during the bidding may be changed during the implementation of this Contract. Subcontractors must submit the documentary requirements under Section 23.1 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 and comply with the eligibility criteria specified in ITB Clause 5 to the implementing or end-user unit.

7.3. Subcontracting of any portion of the Project does not relieve the Contractor of any liability or obligation under the Contract. The Supplier will be responsible for the acts, defaults, and negligence of any subcontractor, its agents, servants, or workmen as fully as if these were the Contractor's own acts, defaults, or negligence, or those of its agents, servants, or workmen.

8. Pre-Bid Conference

The Procuring Entity will hold a pre-bid conference for this Project on the specified date and time and either at its physical address and/or through videoconferencing/webcasting as indicated in paragraph 6 of the IB.

9. Clarification and Amendment of Bidding Documents

Prospective bidders may request for clarification on and/or interpretation of any part of the Bidding Documents. Such requests must be in writing and received by the Procuring Entity, either at its given address or through electronic mail indicated in the **IB**, at least ten (10) calendar days before the deadline set for the submission and receipt of Bids.

10. Documents Comprising the Bid: Eligibility and Technical Components

- 10.1. The first envelope shall contain the eligibility and technical documents of the Bid as specified in Section IX. Checklist of Technical and Financial Documents.
- 10.2. If the eligibility requirements or statements, the bids, and all other documents for submission to the BAC are in foreign language other than English, it must be accompanied by a translation in English, which shall be authenticated by the appropriate Philippine foreign service establishment, post, or the equivalent office having jurisdiction over the foreign bidder's affairs in the Philippines. For Contracting Parties to the Apostille Convention, only the translated documents shall be authenticated through an apostille pursuant to GPPB Resolution No. 13-2019 dated 23 May 2019. The English translation shall govern, for purposes of interpretation of the bid.
- 10.3. A valid PCAB License is required, and in case of joint ventures, a valid special PCAB License, and registration for the type and cost of the contract for this Project. Any additional type of Contractor license or permit shall be indicated in the **BDS**.
- 10.4. A List of Contractor's key personnel (e.g., Project Manager, Project Engineers, Materials Engineers, and Foremen) assigned to the contract to be bid, with their complete qualification and experience data shall be provided. These key personnel must meet the required minimum years of experience set in the **BDS**.
- 10.5. A List of Contractor's major equipment units, which are owned, leased, and/or under purchase agreements, supported by proof of ownership, certification of

availability of equipment from the equipment lessor/vendor for the duration of the project, as the case may be, must meet the minimum requirements for the contract set in the **BDS**.

11. Documents Comprising the Bid: Financial Component

- 11.1. The second bid envelope shall contain the financial documents for the Bid as specified in Section IX. Checklist of Technical and Financial Documents.
- 11.2. Any bid exceeding the ABC indicated in paragraph 1 of the **IB** shall not be accepted.
- 11.3. For Foreign-funded procurement, a ceiling may be applied to bid prices provided the conditions are met under Section 31.2 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

12. Alternative Bids

Bidders shall submit offers that comply with the requirements of the Bidding Documents, including the basic technical design as indicated in the drawings and specifications. Unless there is a value engineering clause in the **BDS**, alternative Bids shall not be accepted.

13. Bid Prices

All bid prices for the given scope of work in the Project as awarded shall be considered as fixed prices, and therefore not subject to price escalation during contract implementation, except under extraordinary circumstances as determined by the NEDA and approved by the GPPB pursuant to the revised Guidelines for Contract Price Escalation guidelines.

14. Bid and Payment Currencies

- 14.1. Bid prices may be quoted in the local currency or tradeable currency accepted by the BSP at the discretion of the Bidder. However, for purposes of bid evaluation, Bids denominated in foreign currencies shall be converted to Philippine currency based on the exchange rate as published in the BSP reference rate bulletin on the day of the bid opening.
- 14.2. Payment of the contract price shall be made in Philippine Pesos.

15. Bid Security

15.1. The Bidder shall submit a Bid Securing Declaration or any form of Bid Security in the amount indicated in the **BDS**, which shall be not less than the percentage of the ABC in accordance with the schedule in the **BDS**.

15.2. The Bid and bid security shall be valid one hundred twenty (120) calendar days from the date of opening of bids. Any bid not accompanied by an acceptable bid security shall be rejected by the Procuring Entity as non-responsive.

16. Sealing and Marking of Bids

Each Bidder shall submit one copy of the first and second components of its Bid.

The Procuring Entity may request additional hard copies and/or electronic copies of the Bid. However, failure of the Bidders to comply with the said request shall not be a ground for disqualification.

If the Procuring Entity allows the submission of bids through online submission to the given website or any other electronic means, the Bidder shall submit an electronic copy of its Bid, which must be digitally signed. An electronic copy that cannot be opened or is corrupted shall be considered non-responsive and, thus, automatically disqualified.

17. Deadline for Submission of Bids

The Bidders shall submit on the specified date and time and either at its physical address or through online submission as indicated in paragraph 7 of the IB.

18. Opening and Preliminary Examination of Bids

18.1. The BAC shall open the Bids in public at the time, on the date, and at the place specified in paragraph 9 of the **IB**. The Bidders' representatives who are present shall sign a register evidencing their attendance. In case videoconferencing, webcasting or other similar technologies will be used, attendance of participants shall likewise be recorded by the BAC Secretariat.

In case the Bids cannot be opened as scheduled due to justifiable reasons, the rescheduling requirements under Section 29 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 shall prevail.

18.2. The preliminary examination of Bids shall be governed by Section 30 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

19. Detailed Evaluation and Comparison of Bids

- 19.1. The Procuring Entity's BAC shall immediately conduct a detailed evaluation of all Bids rated "passed" using non-discretionary pass/fail criteria. The BAC shall consider the conditions in the evaluation of Bids under Section 32.2 of 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.
- 19.2. If the Project allows partial bids, all Bids and combinations of Bids as indicated in the **BDS** shall be received by the same deadline and opened and evaluated simultaneously so as to determine the Bid or combination of Bids offering the lowest calculated cost to the Procuring Entity. Bid Security as required by **ITB** Clause 16 shall be submitted for each contract (lot) separately.

19.3. In all cases, the NFCC computation pursuant to Section 23.4.2.6 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 must be sufficient for the total of the ABCs for all the lots participated in by the prospective Bidder.

20. Post Qualification

Within a non-extendible period of five (5) calendar days from receipt by the Bidder of the notice from the BAC that it submitted the Lowest Calculated Bid, the Bidder shall submit its latest income and business tax returns filed and paid through the BIR Electronic Filing and Payment System (eFPS), and other appropriate licenses and permits required by law and stated in the **BDS**.

21. Signing of the Contract

The documents required in Section 37.2 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 shall form part of the Contract. Additional Contract documents are indicated in the **BDS**.

Section IV. General Conditions of Contract

1. Scope of Contract

This Contract shall include all such items, although not specifically mentioned, that can be reasonably inferred as being required for its completion as if such items were expressly mentioned herein. All the provisions of RA No. 9184 and its 2016 revised IRR, including the Generic Procurement Manual, and associated issuances, constitute the primary source for the terms and conditions of the Contract, and thus, applicable in contract implementation. Herein clauses shall serve as the secondary source for the terms and conditions of the Contract.

This is without prejudice to Sections 74.1 and 74.2 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 allowing the GPPB to amend the IRR, which shall be applied to all procurement activities, the advertisement, posting, or invitation of which were issued after the effectivity of the said amendment.

2. Sectional Completion of Works

If sectional completion is specified in the Special Conditions of Contract (SCC), references in the Conditions of Contract to the Works, the Completion Date, and the Intended Completion Date shall apply to any Section of the Works (other than references to the Completion Date and Intended Completion Date for the whole of the Works).

3. Possession of Site

- 3.1 The Procuring Entity shall give possession of all or parts of the Site to the Contractor based on the schedule of delivery indicated in the SCC, which corresponds to the execution of the Works. If the Contractor suffers delay or incurs cost from failure on the part of the Procuring Entity to give possession in accordance with the terms of this clause, the Procuring Entity's Representative shall give the Contractor a Contract Time Extension and certify such sum as fair to cover the cost incurred, which sum shall be paid by Procuring Entity.
- 3.2 If possession of a portion is not given by the above date, the Procuring Entity will be deemed to have delayed the start of the relevant activities. The resulting adjustments in contract time to address such delay may be addressed through contract extension provided under Annex "E" of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

4. The Contractor's Obligations

The Contractor shall employ the key personnel named in the Schedule of Key Personnel indicating their designation, in accordance with **ITB** Clause 10.3 and specified in the **BDS**, to carry out the supervision of the Works.

The Procuring Entity will approve any proposed replacement of key personnel only if their relevant qualifications and abilities are equal to or better than those of the personnel listed in the Schedule.

5. Performance Security

- 5.1. Within ten (10) calendar days from receipt of the Notice of Award from the Procuring Entity but in no case later than the signing of the contract by both parties, the successful Bidder shall furnish the performance security in any of the forms prescribed in Section 39 of the 2016 revised IRR.
- 5.2. The Contractor, by entering into the Contract with the Procuring Entity, acknowledges the right of the Procuring Entity to institute action pursuant to RA No. 3688 against any subcontractor be they an individual, firm, partnership, corporation, or association supplying the Contractor with labor, materials and/or equipment for the performance of this Contract.

6. Site Investigation Reports

The Contractor, in preparing the Bid, shall rely on any Site Investigation Reports referred to in the SCC supplemented by any information obtained by the Contractor.

7. Warranty

- 7.1. In case the Contractor fails to undertake the repair works under Section 62.2.2 of the 2016 revised IRR, the Procuring Entity shall forfeit its performance security, subject its property(ies) to attachment or garnishment proceedings, and perpetually disqualify it from participating in any public bidding. All payables of the GOP in his favor shall be offset to recover the costs.
- 7.2. The warranty against Structural Defects/Failures, except that occasioned-on force majeure, shall cover the period from the date of issuance of the Certificate of Final Acceptance by the Procuring Entity. Specific duration of the warranty is found in the SCC.

8. Liability of the Contractor

Subject to additional provisions, if any, set forth in the SCC, the Contractor's liability under this Contract shall be as provided by the laws of the Republic of the Philippines. If the Contractor is a joint venture, all partners to the joint venture shall be jointly and severally liable to the Procuring Entity.

9. Termination for Other Causes

Contract termination shall be initiated in case it is determined *prima facie* by the Procuring Entity that the Contractor has engaged, before, or during the implementation of the contract, in unlawful deeds and behaviors relative to contract acquisition and implementation, such as, but not limited to corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, coercive, and obstructive practices as stated in **ITB** Clause 4.

10. Dayworks

Subject to the guidelines on Variation Order in Annex "E" of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184, and if applicable as indicated in the SCC, the Dayworks rates in the Contractor's Bid shall be used for small additional amounts of work only when the

Procuring Entity's Representative has given written instructions in advance for additional work to be paid for in that way.

11. Program of Work

- 11.1. The Contractor shall submit to the Procuring Entity's Representative for approval the said Program of Work showing the general methods, arrangements, order, and timing for all the activities in the Works. The submissions of the Program of Work are indicated in the SCC.
- 11.2. The Contractor shall submit to the Procuring Entity's Representative for approval an updated Program of Work at intervals no longer than the period stated in the SCC. If the Contractor does not submit an updated Program of Work within this period, the Procuring Entity's Representative may withhold the amount stated in the SCC from the next payment certificate and continue to withhold this amount until the next payment after the date on which the overdue Program of Work has been submitted.

12. Instructions, Inspections and Audits

The Contractor shall permit the GOP or the Procuring Entity to inspect the Contractor's accounts and records relating to the performance of the Contractor and to have them audited by auditors of the GOP or the Procuring Entity, as may be required.

13. Advance Payment

The Procuring Entity shall, upon a written request of the Contractor which shall be submitted as a Contract document, make an advance payment to the Contractor in an amount not exceeding fifteen percent (15%) of the total contract price, to be made in lump sum, or at the most two installments according to a schedule specified in the SCC, subject to the requirements in Annex "E" of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

14. Progress Payments

The Contractor may submit a request for payment for Work accomplished. Such requests for payment shall be verified and certified by the Procuring Entity's Representative/Project Engineer. Except as otherwise stipulated in the SCC, materials and equipment delivered on the site but not completely put in place shall not be included for payment.

15. Operating and Maintenance Manuals

- 15.1. If required, the Contractor will provide "as built" Drawings and maintenance manuals as specified in the SCC.
- 15.2. If the Contractor does not provide the Drawings and/or manuals by the dates stated above, or they do not receive the Procuring Entity's Representative's approval, the Procuring Entity's Representative may withhold the amount stated in the SCC from payments due to the Contractor.

TERMS OF REFERENCE

SCOPE OF WORK FOR THE SUPPLY OF LABOR AND MATERIALS FOR THE REPLACEMENT OF CEILING AT THE PLENARY HALL

I. General Scope of Work:

The works shall be supply of materials, labor, tools, equipment and other services incidental necessary for the replacement of ceiling at the Plenary Hall. The work shall be completed within twenty-eight (28) Calendar days from December 23, 2024 to January 19, 2025. The work shall be in 24/7 schedule, which requires three (3) shift schedule.

II. Detailed Scope of Work:

The Contractor shall perform the following works, but not limited to the following:

1. Mobilization

Manpower, tools, equipment, temporary facilities and portalet.

2. Health and Safety requirements

- a. Personal Protective Equipment (PPE). The Contractor shall comply with the requirements under DPWH and DOH (protocol against COVID-19).
- b. Use safety goggles, gloves, dust mask and hard hat to protect from dust, debris, and any falling materials.
- c. The Contractor shall install four (4) safety signage, same as the PICC standard signage, 22" x 32", printed in sintra board. See attached drawing.
- d. All workers shall wear their company uniform.
- e. The Contractor shall have first aid kit.

3. Site preparation

- a. Remove furniture, fixtures, and any other items from the room to create a safe working space.
- b. Installation of floor and equipment protection. Lay down drop cloths or plastic sheets to catch debris to protect the floor and equipment from damage.

4. Scaffolding work

- a. Inspect the entire floor surface to ensure all components are securely connected and the scaffold is stable. Base plates or screw jacks shall be stable to distribute the load evenly. If the ground is uneven, use adjustable base plates.
- b. Ensure all scaffolding components, such as frames, braces, planks, and base plates, are in good condition.
- c. Double-check the guardrails, toe boards, and access points are in place and compliant with safety regulations.
- d. Continuously inspect the scaffolding and make necessary adjustments to maintain the scaffold's safety and stability.



5. Dismantling of existing ceiling boards

- a. Removal of the lighting and other existing fixtures attached to the ceiling boards. If there is wiring, disconnect it safely. Ensure wires are capped off or secured to avoid accidental contact.
- b. Shut off the electricity to the room, especially if there are light fixtures or electrical wiring in the ceiling. This prevents any risk of electrical shock.
- c. Carefully remove the ceiling boards to avoid damaging the underlying structure or ceiling frames and avoid falling uncontrollably. Once the ceiling board is removed, inspect the underlying structure for any signs of damage, such as rot, mold, or structural issues.
- d. Removed ceiling boards shall be placed in a designated area for disposal.
- e. Use a vacuum cleaner to remove dust and debris from the exposed area.
- f. Inspect the underlying structure for any signs of damage and replace all nailers/joists with structural issues.

6. Installation of new ceiling boards

- a. The nailers shall be inspected and approved by PICC Representative before installation of ceiling boards.
- b. Ceiling boards shall be Narra plywood, ½" (10mm) thick. In varnish finish. Dimensions shall vary accordingly with the existing ceiling board nailers/joists.
- c. Use nail gun equipment for the installation of new ceiling boards.
- d. Nails shall be spaced 6-8 inches (15-20 cm) apart along the edges and in the field (center area) of the board. Maintain a distance of about 1/2 inch (1.2 cm) from the edges of the board.
- e. Use additional fasteners e.g. screws, if needed, to ensure that the ceiling boards are securely attached to the ceiling joists to prevent sagging or warping over time.

 Checking the condition of the nailers, look for signs of rot, warping, or structural damage.
- f. Retouch varnish finish of the new ceiling boards for any dent or scratches due to installation.

7. Reinstallation of electrical and lighting fixtures

- a. Secure the of electrical and lighting fixtures to the ceiling or designated supports.
- b. Ensure fixtures are properly aligned and level.
- c. Testing of each fixture to ensure it is functioning correctly and that all connections are secure.
- 8. Restoration and cleaning of all affected area. The floor, carpet and chairs shall be vacuum cleaned before leaving the area.
- 9. Hauling out of the debris outside the PICC. All removed ceiling boards and other garbage/debris shall be hauled out at the expense of the Contractor and turn over the area ready for use.
- 10. Demobilization.

III. General Conditions:

- 1. The Contract Documents, Specifications and Drawings are mutually complimentary. What is noted in one although not shown in other shall be considered contained in all, in case of conflict. The Specifications shall prevail over the Drawings. The documents forming the Contract shall be interpreted in the following order of priority:
 - a. Contract/Construction Agreement



- b. Contractor's Bid
- c. Special Conditions of the Contract
- d. Drawings
- e. Any other document listed in the Special Conditions of the Contract as form part of the Contract
- 2. The Bidders shall examine all the issued documents relating to the work and must have verified all the existing conditions at the site. No consideration will be given for any alleged misunderstanding or misinterpretation of the specifications and materials to be used or work to be done.
- 3. The Bidders shall inspect and examine the site and the surroundings of the project to arrive at a reasonable estimate of the labor, materials, equipment, facilities and services necessary to carry out the works.

IV. Contractor's Obligation:

- 1. The CONTRACTOR shall perform all works necessary to fully accomplished the project.
- 2. A joint ocular inspection must be conducted by the Contractor and PICC Representative, on the specific works to be done for the Replacement of Ceiling at Plenary Hall.
- 3. The CONTRACTOR shall inspect and examine the site and the surroundings of the proposed project to arrive at a reasonable estimate of the labor, materials, equipment, facilities and services necessary to carry out the works.
- 4. The CONTRACTOR shall commence execution of the works on the Start Date and shall carry out the works in accordance with the program of work submitted by the CONTRACTOR, as updated with the approval of PICC Representative and complete them by the intended completion date.
- 5. The CONTRACTOR shall provide all supervision, labor, materials, plant and Contractor's equipment, which may be required.
- 6. Sub-contracting of works is not allowed.
- 7. The CONTRACTOR shall be liable to all fire and accident claims and other related claims arising from the injuries and damages, which occurred in the vicinity.
- 8. The CONTRACTOR shall free the PICC and its personnel from and against all liability for damages arising from injuries or liabilities to persons or damages to property by any act of omissions of the Contractor including any and all expenses which may be incurred in the defense of any claim, action or suit.
- 9. Any work that may affect the operation, security and image of the Center shall be coordinated properly with PICC-BSD-TSD Representative and shall be done in accordance with the Center's approved schedule.



- 10. Cost of rework and restoration or replacement of all damaged properties due to CONTRACTOR'S poor workmanship or negligence shall be borne by the Contractor.
- 11. The CONTRACTOR shall submit list of personnel assigned to the project including their NBI clearances/Barangay clearance and permit to work before commencing the above scope of works.
- 12. The CONTRACTOR's personnel/workers shall wear at all times their uniform, company ID and PPEs while working inside the Center.
- 13. Tapping of equipment and other related works shall be properly coordinated with PICC Representative for provision of power and water. For this purpose, the CONTRACTOR shall provide sub-meters for power and water consumptions.

V. Workmanship:

The work throughout shall be executed in the best and most thorough manner to the satisfaction of PICC and its engineers and supervisors who will jointly interpret the meaning of the scope of work and its conditions and shall have the power to reject any work, method of accomplishing every part of work and material used which in their judgment are not in full accordance therewith and are disadvantageous to PICC.

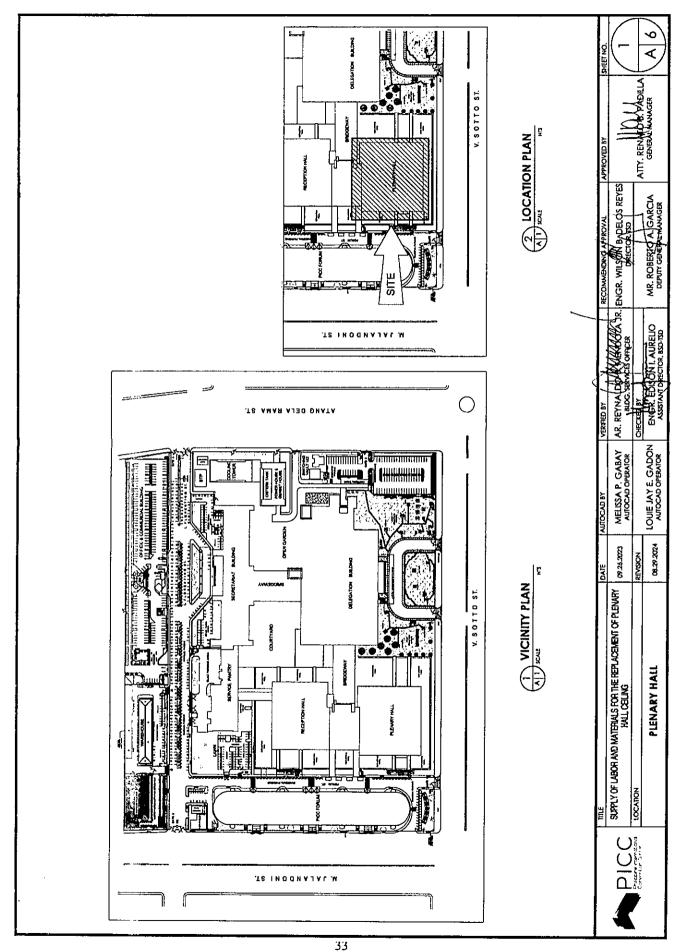
VI. Liquidated Damages (LD):

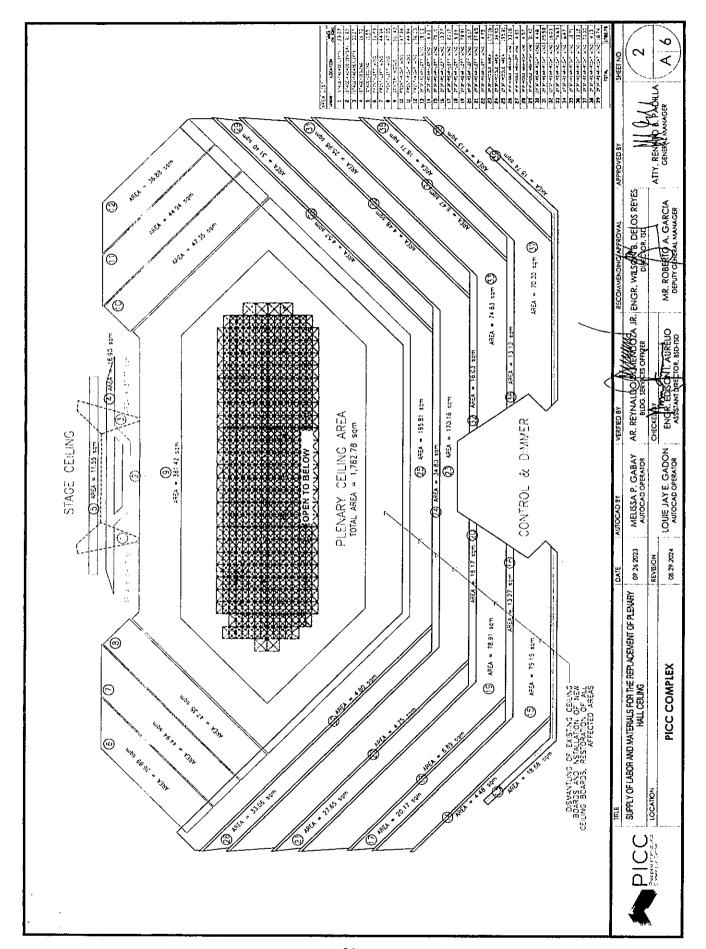
In case of delay in the completion period inclusive of duly granted time extensions, if any, the Contractor shall be liable for damages and shall pay the PICC for liquidated damages in an amount equivalent to at least one tenth (1/10) of one percent (1%) of the cost of the unperformed services for every day of delay.

The maximum LD shall be ten percent (10%) of the amount of contract. Once the cumulative amount of liquidated damages reaches ten percent (10%) of the amount of the Contract, the procuring entity shall rescind the award without prejudice to other courses of action and remedies open to it.

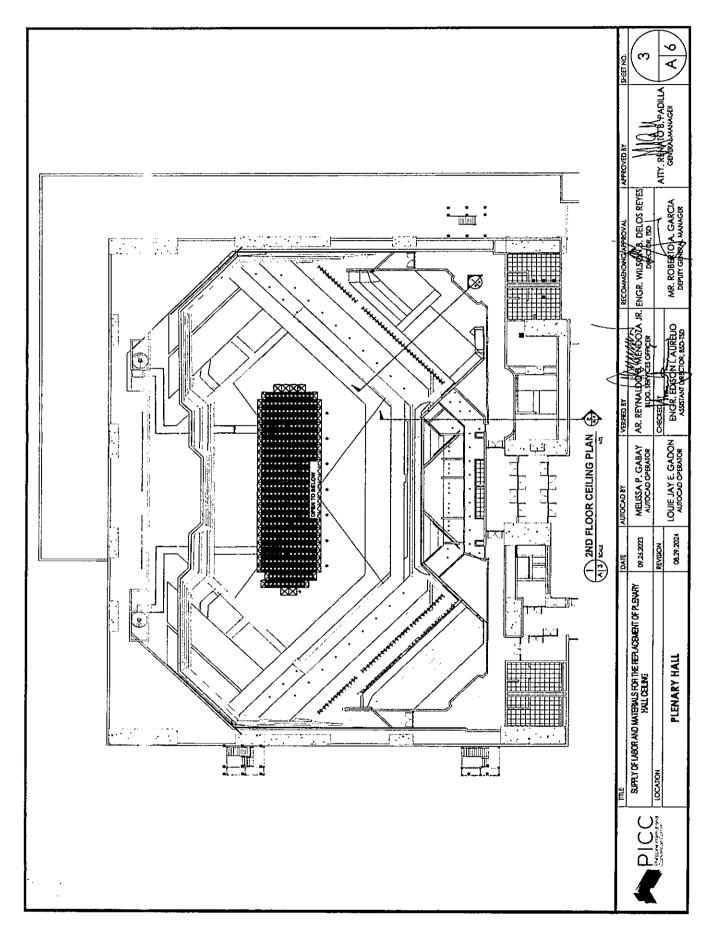
